MAAK ANNOUNCE LAUNCH OF MAAK FOUNDATION

London, **2022**: Maak is delighted to announce the launch of Maak Foundation, a charitable initiative with the primary purpose of supporting and promoting studio ceramics. By providing funding towards the publication of books dedicated to studio ceramics the aim is to stimulate an ever wider appreciation and understanding of this specialist creative art form.

Initiated and founded by Marijke Varrall-Jones, Maak Foundation's Board of Trustees will award grants of between £1,000 - £5,000 with submissions welcomed twice a year. Grants will provide focused funding for primary research, with supported projects resulting in the publication of books and literary material that will be available to the general public and have a clear art-historical perspective.




"Over the 20 or so years of specialising in studio ceramics I have actively expand my library at every opportunity. Yet studio ceramics is relatively underrepresented in art-historical literature terms. So many of our most important ceramic artists or developments in studio ceramics as a movement are only superficially referenced with only a handful afforded the accolade of comprehensive exploration. With Maak Foundation our hope is to provide much needed funding to authors, institutions and publishers looking to publish high quality books and literary materials on this subject, allowing many

more people to build a deeper understanding and appreciation of the artistic contributions of these artists and craftspeople. Through supporting research, we can support the publication of books and public displays celebrating the very best ceramics. John Ward has a longstanding reputation as one of Britain's most important and influential potters, and yet very little has been written about the manifold achievements of his fifty-year career. In close collaboration with Ward's family, Emma Crichton-Miller has written an authoritative and enlightening account of his life and work which firmly places his influence within the history of British Studio Pottery.

The book has been made possible thanks to the generous support of Maak Foundation, the Loewe Foundation and a number of private donations.

Maak Foundation was formed with the purpose of advancing the education and understanding of studio ceramics by providing funding for research and projects that will result in the publication of material and resources for the wider public.

Funding is available to individuals and organisations through grants with applications open for submission two times per year. Funding priorities are for:

- Research into important individual ceramic artists, groups of ceramic artists or broader artistic developments in studio ceramics for subsequent publication.
- Written material to support non-commercial exhibitions of studio ceramics intended to provide educational opportunities to the general public.

Applications for the next round of funding will open for submission on 2nd January 2023, and close on 31 January.
